A special meeting of the Board of Trustees of the Village of Celoron, New York was held on Monday, July 23, 2012 at 7:00 P.M.

Members Present: Mayor Keeney, Trustees Kogut, Mattison, Schrecengost and Young

Mayor Keeney called the meeting to order, asked the Clerk to call the roll and led the Pledge of Allegiance.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES:

Trustee Mattison motioned, seconded by Trustee Young to approve the minutes of the Regular Meeting held on July 9, 2012.

PARKS & RECREATION – Trustee Young reported that the Summer Concerts were continuing in the park.

SPECIAL EVENTS – Trustee Mattison stated that there were only 8 participants in the Karaoke Contest; therefore, winners were selected and the contest scheduled for August 17th has been cancelled.

LOCAL LAW TO BE PRESENTED:

LOCAL LAW NO. 2 OF 2012

**A LOCAL LAW AMENDING SECTION 18-2.A.(15) OF
THE CODE OF THE VILLAGE OF CELORON, NEW YORK**

BE IT ENACTED by the Village Board of the Village of Celoron, New York, pursuant to the authority and provisions of §10 of the Municipal Home Rule Law and §7-725a of the New York State Village Law, as follows:

1. **Intent.** Amend Section 18-2.A.(15) Parking requirements of the Vehicle and Traffic Section of the Code of the Village of Celoron to prohibit parking on the north side of Boulevard Avenue between Dunham Avenue and Edgewater Street.
2. **Amendment.** Section 18-2.A.(15) Parking requirements, of the Code of the Village of Celoron be and hereby is amended to read as follows:

On the north side of Boulevard Avenue from Dunham Avenue east to the intersection of the easterly line of Edgewater Street.

3. **Conflicting Statutes.** All local laws or ordinances or parts of local laws or ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.
4. **Severability.** Should any clause, sentence, paragraph, subdivision, section or other part of this local law be adjudicated by any court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, such judgment, decree or order shall not affect, impair or invalidate the remainder thereof, but shall be confined in its operation to the clause, sentence, paragraph, subdivision, section or other part thereof directly involved in the controversy in which such judgment, decree or order shall have been rendered and to this end, the provisions of each section of this local law are hereby declared to be severable.
5. **Effective Date.** This local law shall become effective immediately upon filing with the New York State Secretary of State.

Trustee Mattison moved, seconded by Trustee Schrecengost to approve the local law.

Trustee Young stated that she did not believe anyone was in favor of this local law. Highway Superintendent Schrecengost stated that this change would make it easier for the highway department to plow and maintain the street. Trustee Mattison stated that he had many comments in favor of the local law and felt it would be safer for the public. Trustee Young stated that she did not feel there was a problem. Trustee Mattison disagreed. Trustee Young questioned what would happen if people parked there anyway and created a traffic jam. Trustee Schrecengost responded that violators would be ticketed. Mayor Keeney stated that he did not feel it would be that difficult for people to adjust to the change. Trustee Young expressed concerns that no one had petitioned the board for this change or brought concerns to the board over this issue. She did not see a problem with allowing parking on the north side of the street. Mayor Keeney reviewed problems encountered when large trucks meet other larger vehicles and questioned why the Village would want to impede traffic on Boulevard, the main street. Trustee Schrecengost reminded the Board that this was part of the recently adopted LWRP.

OPPORTUNITY FOR PUBLIC COMMENT:

Peter Page, 31 Boulevard Ave., stated that he guessed he should have said something before. He thought that the kids in the parking lot would be more of a problem than the problem on the street.

Mayor Keeney reminded Mr. Page that Linsey is really a public street not a bike path and said that the only comments he had received were that it was a good idea to prohibit parking on the north side of Boulevard in the interest of public safety.

Trustee Schrecengost motioned to adjourn the meeting. Trustee Mattison seconded the motion.
