CELORON YOUTH RECREATION: The free Summer Youth Recreation Program is once again offered for children/grandchildren (ages 5-12) of parents and/or grandparents currently living in the Village of Celoron. The program will run every Tuesday and Wednesday from 9:00 a.m. to noon and on Thursday (from 9:00 a.m. to noon, or noon to 3:00 p.m. depending upon the scheduled field trip) for four continuous weeks, starting on June 30th and ending on July 23rd. Register your children after June 1st at Celoron Village Hall to make sure that they won't miss the fun activities and field trips (Jamestown Audubon Society, Children's Safety Village, Midway State Park, and swimming at the SWCS pool) this July!

COMMUNITY PICNIC: Celoron Residents' Picnic, Saturday, August 1st!

It's official! The sixth annual Celoron Community Picnic is scheduled for the middle of the summer this year, so that more families will be able to attend. As always, the Village will provide all of the hamburgers, hot dogs, condiments and cold drinks. So mark your calendars. Further information will follow closer to the date.

CODE ENFORCEMENT: The Code Enforcement Officer's summer hours at the Celoron Village Hall are **Mondays, 5:00 to 7:00 p.m. and Fridays, 8:00 a.m. to 12:00 noon.** Remember that **Building Permits** are required for Sheds, Roofs, Fences, Pools, Additions, etc. (Pools installed after 2006 are required to have an

alarm, be inspected by the Code Enforcement Officer and have either a 48" high fence, or be the pool itself must be 48" high. Pick up flyers explaining pool requirements at Village Hall.) Building Permit Application Forms are available at either the Celoron Village Hall, or the Village Website at www.celoronny.org; completed applications should be submitted to Village Hall, and will be reviewed for approval by Mr. Burkholder.

After a long winter, finally Spring is here and it's time to beautify our Village. Remember that the Village of Celoron Property Maintenance Code requires yards to be free of garbage, rubbish, old appliances, debris, vegetation over 10" high, uninspected or junk (wrecked, discarded, dismantled or inoperable) vehicles.

2015 BRUSH DISPOSAL: For your convenience, you may dispose of grass clippings, leaves, twigs, brush and small branches (small enough to be handled by one person) this summer at the designated area of the Village of Celoron Highway Garage, 50 Gifford Avenue every other Monday from 4:00 p.m. to 7:00 p.m. Please empty your containers, boxes or bags of brush. (NO BAGS, BOXES or CONTAINERS may be discarded there.) Maximum of one cubic yard per vehicle is allowed. (Landscape experts suggest that grass clippings be left on your lawn.) The Village will post the list of participants and advertise in the newspaper.

SHOW YOUR COLORS: Weather, wind and time damage our flags that line our Village streets. The Show Your Colors program was initiated to dress up our community's appearance and honor America. Donations for the flag fund are always welcome so that torn and tattered flags may be replaced along our Village streets. At Village Hall, you will find the Show Your Colors donation jar for cash, and checks made out to "Village of Celoron" with the notation "Show Your Colors Fund".
