VETERANS' DAY: In cooperation with the Herman Kent Post #777, the Village of Celoron held a ceremony at 11:00 a.m. on Saturday, November 11, 2017 at the Veterans' Memorial in Lucille Ball Memorial Park. Deputy Mayor Mary Keeney welcomed all to the ceremony. The invocation was given by Jetta Wilson, Deputy Clerk and Village resident. Southwestern Central School student and Village resident Chris Quinn sang the National Anthem. Mark Wilson, Village resident and Zoning Board of Appeals member read the names of the Village of Celoron residents who lost their lives serving our country. Carl Olander, Commander, Herman Kent Post #777 struck the bell to honor each individual. The main address was given by David Holmstrom, a Village resident and US Navy Veteran.

WINTER PARKING REGULATIONS: We remind you that November 1st begins the Village's Winter Parking Rules. I have been asked by the Highway Department to remind you of exactly what those regulations are and the consequences of failing to comply. Between the hours of 2:00 a.m. to 7:00 a.m. from November 1st to April 1st, the Village of Celoron does not allow roadside parking. All persons with or access to driveways and/or garages are expected to park off the roadways. This is necessary for winter snow plowing. In order to complete the required task of snowplowing, the Village will adhere to the following: A note on the car windshield will be your first and only warning of a violation of the Winter Parking Regulations. A second violation during this winter season could cause, at your expense, your vehicle being towed. The Village of Celoron takes their responsibility of snowplowing seriously and asks that you cooperate with the Village's attempt to serve the entire Village.
